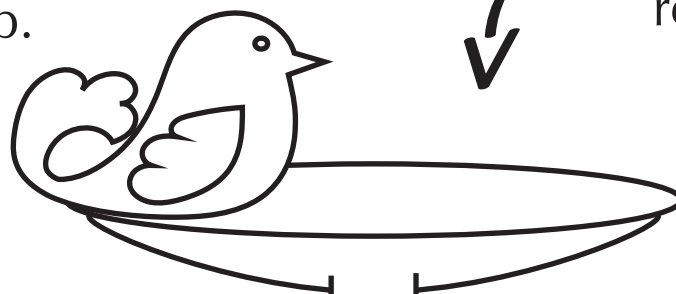




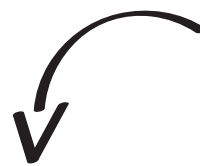
Birds in your Garden

Put different types of feeders up.

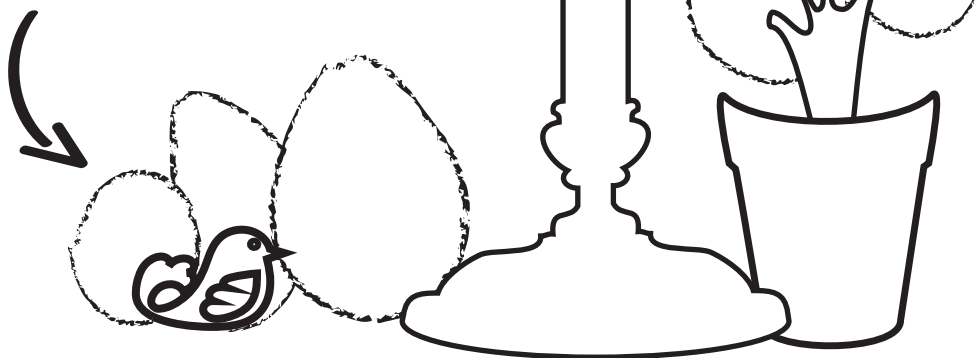


A bird bath filled regularly with fresh water can be a lifesaver!

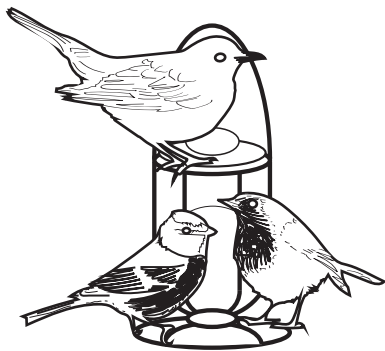
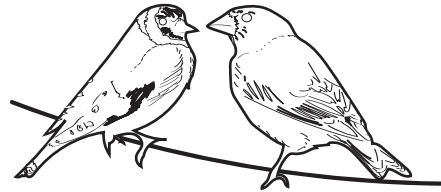

Which Birds Eat What?

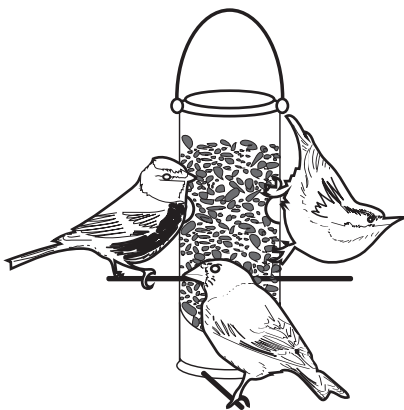
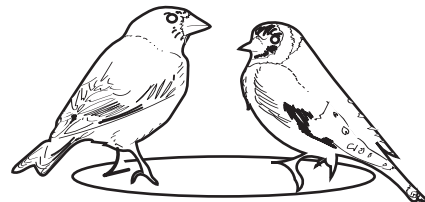
Different feed will bring a variety of birds to your garden.

Goldfinches and Greenfinches will
love finding this in your garden.



Peanuts are rich in fat and
help Blue Tits, Greenfinches,
House Sparrows & Nuthatches
survive cold times.

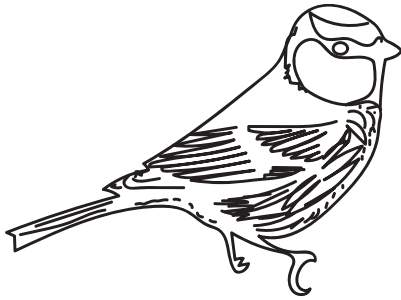

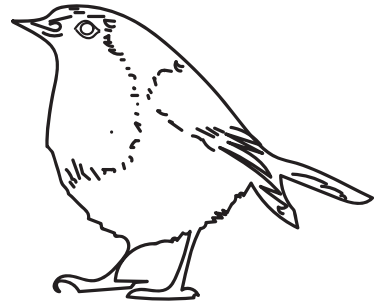


The Millbrook Bird Bingo

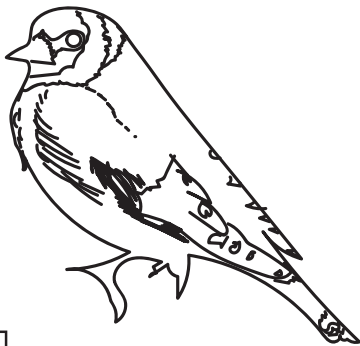
Look out for birds in your garden! Which ones can you see?

Blue Tit



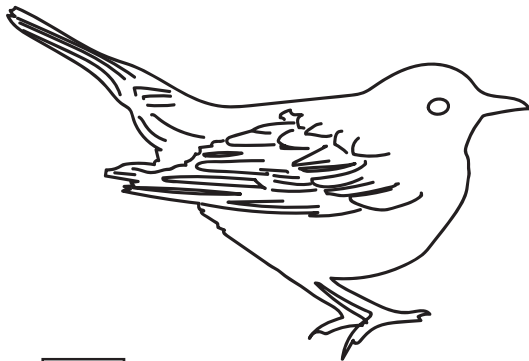
Robin

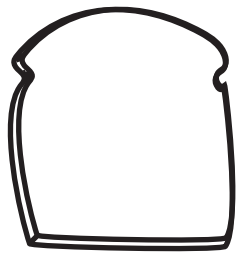

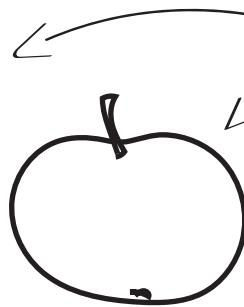


Treat the birds in your garden with a scrumptious home-made kebab to feast on.

Cut these into cube-sized pieces.



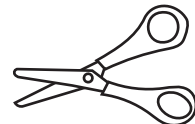
Raisins

Floral wire



Scissors and knife

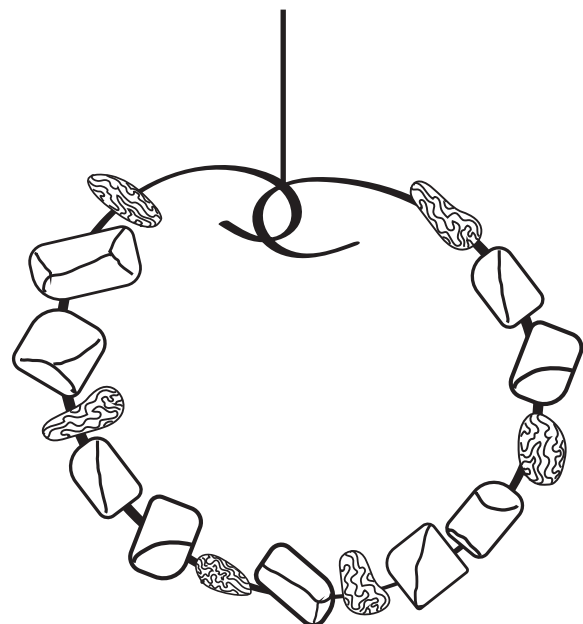
1. Carefully thread each piece of food on the floral wire, leaving about 8cm at either end.



2. Bend the ends into little hooks.

3. Bend the wire to form a circle, holding the ends together.

4. Tie a loop of string on the wire circle and hang your scrumptious kebab up for the birds to feast on.
